



2nd Asian Equestrian Federation (AEF) U-21 Dressage Championship

The Championship including Qualifiers and Finals for **age riders (athletes) no more than 21 years old** (till 31st December of which they reach their 21st birthday in the starting year of the qualifiers) is held from **August to the dates of the Final Competition** in accordance with the FEI Dressage, FEI General Regulations, and Veterinary Regulations currently in force.

ARTICLE 1 - PRINCIPLES

1.1 The AEF Asian U-21 Dressage Championship consists of:

➤ **The Zone Qualification Competition (Qualifier):**

The qualification completion will be held in rider's own countries on their own horses. The event to be held in each participating NF served as Qualifier to the Final Competition is open to a maximum of **40** but a minimum of **3** starters for every NF with AEF full membership. If participating NF has less riders in the U-21 Qualifier, the Ground Jury can help to judge up to 40 riders including national competitions organized in the framework of the Championship. It is expected to have all qualifiers scheduled by AEF and finished before December 31 2019.

➤ **The Championship Final Competition on Borrowed Horses:**

The championship Final with **16 Finalists** to be held on borrowed horses is only for the **13 best riders from zone ranking lists** (as article 11.2) and **3 riders from the hosting NF** (the Organizer of the Final Competition). The number of best riders from zone ranking list is subject to change, based on the numbers of borrowed horses available and participating NFs, if necessary. The final competition is a three (3) round competition with different horses ridden in each round.

1.3 Formula

➤ **The Zone Qualification Competition (Qualifier)**

Day 1: Judges' arrival (same appointed judges for one zone)

Day 2: Judges' Free day

Horse Inspection (late afternoon prior to the competition day or in the morning of the competition. However, in extreme tight itinerary, the inspection may be conducted one hour before the competition)

Day 3: Zone Competition (Qualifier)

*Expected to be finished no later than 14:00pm (**Attachment 1**) in case a tight schedule for judges to fly to next NF.*

Schedule Change for horse inspection and competition starting/ending time is allowed under the authority of the Ground Jury or AEF's agreement.

Day 4: Judges' departure

(NB: Each participating NF is responsible for transportation and accommodation (board and lodging) of the judges during their stay in their country.

➤ **The Championship Final Competition on Borrowed Horses** (2nd-5th of April 2020)

The dates and venue are to be finalized and subject to change, if necessary. If there is no Final Competition due to no hosting NF, the Zone winners (the best rider from each zone) on the zone ranking lists will be invited to be in AEF



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General Assembly (GA)/Extra-ordinary GA for honorably receiving the winning prizes (the sponsorship from AEF will be further decided).

Day -1: Arrival Day for Officials (*Technical Delegate (TD), Judges and Chief Steward*)

Preparation works with the OC

Day 0: Arrival Day for Riders and Chef D'equipe

Day 1: Horse Qualification Check and Inspection (*prior to the competition day*)

Rider's Age Check (*passport or confirmable ID presented by riders*)

Technical Meeting and Draws (*starting orders for rounds 1 and 2, and borrowed horse for the 1st round*)

Welcome Dinner

Day 2: Trial Ride (*in the morning with 15 minute test ride to establish the safety*)

Round 1 Competition (*at the afternoon with 20 minute warm-up*)

Day 3: Trial Ride (*in the morning with 15 minute test ride*)

Round 2 Competition (*at the afternoon with 20 minute warm-up*)

Borrowed horses for round 2 will be assigned and based on the ranking of round 1. The horse with higher scores will be ridden by the lower ranking riders. Rider with ranking #1 rides horse that ranked #15, rider with ranking #2 rides horse that ranked #14, and so on.

Round 1 and Round 2 serve as the Final's Qualifier for the Winning Round (Round 3).

Day 4: Draws (starting order and borrowed horses for the final round)

Trial Ride (in the morning with 15 minute test ride)

Final Round Competition –Championship Final and Consolation Final
(at the afternoon with 20 minutes warm-up)

Championship Final –The best 5 riders from the combined ranking of round 1 and round 2 will draw their horses from the new pool of horses being able to do higher level test (i.e. FEI World Dressage Senior 2 Test/FEI TEAM COMPETITION Juniors) and compete for the winner, 2nd place and 3rd place. The Final round (winning round) will be the only round to decide the first 3 places and following places for the championship finals. (NB: The number of riders competing in the higher level test depends on number of higher level horses available)

Consolation Final –The rest of riders not competing for the first 3 places aforesaid will draw their horses from the original pool of horses (if ridden before, must redraw) and compete in the same test level still as previous rounds for 3 Consolation Prizes –1st Excellence Prize (Excellence Prize of AEF President), 2nd Excellence Prize (Excellence Prize of AEF Secretary General, and 3rd Excellence Prize (Excellence Prize of the Organizer).

Prize Giving (All riders will be placed according to the ranking in the higher level test followed by the ranking in the lower level test)

Day 5: Departure Day for Officials and Participants

(Subject to change, if necessary)



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ARTICLE 2 - PARTICIPATION

- 2.1 The AEF U-21 Dressage Championship Competition is open to National Federations (NFs) which are AEF full members.
- 2.2 The **Participation Form (Attachment 2)** must be submitted to the AEF before **May 25, 2019** for expressing the interest to participate the Championship (all forms should be submitted to AEF Dressage Committee with copy to AEF Secretariat.
- 2.3 The **Application Form** for hosting the Championship Finals is in **Attachment 3**. Any NF wishes to host the Finals, please kindly submit it before **May 31, 2019**. If more than one NF make a bid for hosting the Final Competition on Borrowed Horses and no settlement can be reached, AEF Dressage Committee will further review and receive a final approval from AEF Bureau.
- 2.4 The Championship is open to age riders no more than 21 years old (athletes born after 1998) in the year his/her qualifier starts.
- 2.5 In the Championship, "Athletes Living outside their country of nationality" (as defined in the FEI General Regulations) **cannot** compete for their country of residence.
- 2.5 The Championship Competition is open to all horses of any origin provided they have successfully passed the Veterinary Inspection. Horses may compete if they are a minimum of 5 years of age.
- 2.6 The AEF U-21 Asian Dressage Championship **must take precedence over any other competition organized in its framework.**
- 2.7 It is the responsibility of the National Federation to select the participants (horses/riders) for the Zone Competition in strict accordance with the participation rules above and make sure that athletes and horses comply with these rules.
- i. Athlete: An athlete is only allowed to start once in the Championship.
 - ii. Horse: A horse is only allowed to start once in the Championship.



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ARTICLE 3 - GROUND JURY

3.1 The Competition within the Zone is judged by the same Ground Jury, consisting of the same two (2) FEI Dressage Judges appointed by the AEF, who travel from NF to NF until their tour is completed and all competitions have taken place.

3.2 As an exception to Art. 437.1, only two Judges will judge the Zone Competition. The competition will be judged with the President of Ground Jury (PGJ) placed along the short side of the arena at "C" (see Art. 429.5) and the Member at "E". If necessary, they can be at "C" and "B".

In the Final Competition, the Ground Jury however must consist of a minimum of three (3) members as required. Three judges will be placed at "C", "M", and "E". If necessary, they can be at "C", "H", and "B".

3.3 After each competition in the respective NFs, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for establishing a running record as to the results and placing of the individual athletes within the Zone. This running record must be sent to the AEF Dressage Committee with copy to AEF Secretariat immediately following the last competition.

3.4 According to Art. 2 of Codex for FEI Dressage, a judge must avoid any actual or perceived conflict of interest. A judge must have a neutral, independent and fair position towards athletes, owners, trainers, organizers and other officials and integrate well into a team. Financial and/or personal interest must never influence or be perceived to influence his/her way of judging.

3.5 Marking (FEI Dressage Rules Art. 432)

All half marks from 0.5-9.5 may also be used both for movements and the collective marks, at the discretion of the Judges. In the Final Competition on Borrowed Horses, the collective marks will include Paces, Impulsion, Submission, in addition to only Rider's Position and Seat (including Correctness and Effect of the Aids).

ARTICLE 4 – HEADGEAR, DRESS, SADDLERY & ARENA

4.1 Protective Headgear: according to Art. 427.1 dressage rules Protective Headgear has to be worn by all Athletes (as well as any other person) at all



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times while mounted. Any athlete (as well as any other person) violating this provision must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the Protective Headgear is properly in place. Only Protective Headgear is allowed to wear in the Championship.

4.2 Dress: A black or dark blue jacket or tail coat, white or off white breeches, stock or tie, gloves, and black riding boots must be worn.

4.3 Saddlery must be as laid down in Art. 428 of the FEI Dressage Rules. For Senior 1 level, an ordinary snaffle **must** be used. For Senior 2 level, a double bridle is allowed. This applies in the practice and competition arenas. Only snaffles/bridles the borrowed horses originally have can be used for the Championship Finals on borrowed Horses.

Whip: It is forbidden to carry a whip of any kind while competing in the arena. However, the use of one whip, with a total maximum length of 120 cm in the practice area is allowed. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the athlete will entail a penalty. .

Spurs: Spurs are optional but if used, only blunt metal spurs no longer than three and half centimeters (3.5cm) are allowed.

Gadgets: According to Art. 428.4, martingales, breast plates, bit guards, boots, any kind of gadgets (such as bearing, side, running or balancing reins, nasal strips etc.), and any form of blinkers are under penalty of elimination and strictly forbidden. See Article 430 of the Dressage Rules.

4.4 Arena: The arena, flat and level, must be 60 meters long and 20 meters wide.

ARTICLE 5 - HORSE INSPECTION

5.1 Any horse participating must have previously passed a horse inspection carried out by a qualified Veterinarian to be appointed by the Organizing Committee (OC). The Horse Inspection must be undertaken as much as possible in accordance with the FEI General Regulations and FEI Veterinary Rules.



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- 5.2 Horses taking part in the AEF U-21 Dressage Championship competitions in their own country are **not** required to have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a mean of identification and to establish ownership.
- 5.3 All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate. The Inspection must take place on a firm, level and clean but not slippery surface. The horse must be walked and trotted on a loose rein. A Re-inspection is allowed.
- 5.4 At least one Member of the Ground Jury and Technical Delegate (for the Final only) must be present and the Vet. Inspection must take place in principle on the day preceding the Competition.
- 5.5 It is up to the NF to award a Special Prize to the best presented horse based on the Ground Jury & Veterinarian's decision in the Zone Competition.

ARTICLE 6 - THE CLASSIFICATION

- 6.1 Only one ranking list will be established and will count towards the final classification for each zone (Qualifiers).
- 6.2 **The Classification** in each NF of the Zone is decided as follows: the winner is the athlete having the highest total points converted into percentage, the second the one with the next highest total and so on. **In case of equality of points** for the first, second and/or third places, the higher marks attributed by the President of the Ground Jury (in "C") will be decisive for the placing. If a further tie exists, the higher collective mark(s) will be decisive. In case of equality of points for places other than the first three, the Athletes concerned are given the same rank. These also apply in the Zone Ranking as well as the Final Competition.
- 6.3 **The Classification for the Final Competition on Borrowed Horses:**
The combined rider ranking is rankings attained in the Round/Competition 1



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and Round/Competition 2. The 5 riders with the best combined rankings will be eligible to enter into the winning round and compete using more advanced level test (FEI World Dressage Challenge Senior 2 Test – FEI Team Junior Test) for the first three (3) places. The actual number of the riders to enter into the final winning round (Championship Final) depends on the number of borrowed horses available for more advanced test. The rider with the highest percentage scores in the winning round will be declared as the winner, and so on. The 3 best riders in the Consolation Round (Consolation Final) will receive Consolation Prizes. In the event of a tie for the top three placing and consolation prizes, please refer to Article 6.2.

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6.4 Penalties: the penalties as indicated on the test used per class are the reference to be used. First error is zero point five percentage point (0.5%) penalty per judge. Second error is one percentage point (1%) penalty per judge, and third error is elimination.

ARTICLE 7 - THE PRIZES

7.1 The Organizing Committee within each NF is responsible for the distribution of prizes in the normal way (at least one prize for each four athletes) for the Zone Competition (Qualifiers) on their own cost.

7.2 The winner of each NF in the Zone Competition (Winner of the NF Competition) will receive an AEF prize. If there is Final Competition to be held, the zone winner in each Zone Competition (Winner of the Zone Competition) will receive an AEF Certificate.

The three (3) best placed riders in the winning round (higher level test) of the Final Competition (3 best riders of the Championship Final) will receive AEF Trophies. In addition, 3 consolation prizes will be given to the three best riders from the Consolation round (same level test as round 1 and round 2) of the Final Competition (3 best riders of the Consolation Final).

ARTICLE 8 - THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE

8.1 President of ground jury (PGJ) is requested to e-mail the following documents to AEF Dressage Committee and AEF Secretariat **no later than 3 days after the competition:**

- Copy of the results **signed** by the official judges (Attachment 3)
- The number of riders judged by appointed FEI Judges over OTHER competitions (i.e. Non-U21 Competitions) organized during the Championship.

NFs/OCs are requested to use and emailed AEF Dressage Committee and AEF Secretariat the **Official Result Sheet (Attachment 4) in excel format** provided **for the Championship right after the competition.**

8.2 The NFs in the Zone Competition are responsible for the travelling expenses of



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the Judges within each respective country/NF, as well as for the accommodation (board and lodging) during their sojourn. This accommodation must be provided in a standard hotel with modern communication means (internet), which will allow for a certain amount of privacy and comfort to recover from the strain imposed on the Judges on the trip.

- 8.3 The AEF will cover the visa and air travel expenses (actual air flight expense in economy class and fixed amount of EUR 100 for his/her transportation between judge's home airport and home) for the Judges as well as per diem at EUR 120 per day during their sojourn in the Zone Competition.
- 8.4 While preparing publications for the competition (programs, flyers, etc.) the OC is requested to use the AEF Logo, which you will find on the AEF website under: <http://asianef.org>
- 8.5 In Article 11.2, there are more for the OC of the Final Competition to deliver. Besides, any NF is interested in hosting the championship Final, please refer to Article 9.3 for the borrowed Horses to be provided by the OC.

ARTICLE 9 – HORSES FOR THE FINAL COMPETITON

- 9.1 Unlike the zone competition, the riders will ride the horses provided by the OC. The Riders should always and fully comply with the rules set by the OC when they ride the horses provided by the OC.
- 9.2 The draw for rider's borrowed horse shall be made in the presence of Ground Jury, TD, Chefs d'Equipe and Athletes. Same principle shall be applied to the draw for athlete's starting order.
- 9.3 Ideally, the OC should be able to provide 18 horses (including 2 reserves) capable for FEI World Dressage Challenge Senior 1 Test (FEI INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION TEST Children) designated as Group A (Less Advanced Horses). On top of the aforesaid 18 horses, 6 more horses (including 1 reserve) capable for higher level test i.e. FEI World Dressage Senior 2 Test (FEI TEAM COMPETITION Juniors) designated as Group B (More Advanced Horses). **All 24 borrowed horses** in Group A and Group B should not have major fundamental



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issues such as serious irregular steps in paces and tongue problems.

Group A Horses (Less Advanced Horses) should be capable to perform the following movements required in FEI World Dressage Challenge Senior 1 Test (FEI INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION TEST Children):

- Halt
- Volte Right and Left in Trot (10m Ø)
- Circle Right and Left in Trot (20m Ø)
- Shoulder-in Right and Left in Trot
- Working, Collected, and Medium Trots
- Medium Walks
- Turn on the Haunches to the Left and Right in Medium Walk
- Counter Canter
- Collected and Medium Canters
- Stretch Forward Downward of Neck on a Long Rein in Trot
- Transitions
- Serpentine with Two Loops without Changing Leads in Canter
- Simple Change of Leg from Counter Canter to Counter Canter

Group B Horses (More Advanced Horses) should be capable to the aforesaid movements in FEI World Dressage Challenge Senior 1 Test (FEI INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION TEST Children) and the following movements required in FEI World Dressage Senior 2 Test (FEI TEAM COMPETITION Juniors) :

- Rein back
- Extended walks
- Half Pirouette to the Left and Right in Collected Walk
- Extended Trot
- Half Pass to the Left and Right in Canter and Trot
- Flying Change of Leg
- Extended Canter

(Any other alternative horse arrangement may be considered after reviewing the capability of the hosting NF for the Finals)



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ARTICLE 10 - MISCELLANEOUS

- 10.1 Climate: In exceptional weather conditions and with the authority of the Ground Jury, the Competition may be held indoors if the competition arena has the proper measurements. The decision to move indoor must be taken before the beginning of the competition and sufficient time needs to be given to the OC for setting the arena properly.
- 10.2 Horses Schooling: On no account and under penalty of elimination, may any horse take part in the Competition which has been schooled by anyone other than the athlete, mounted in the saddle, in or outside the town where the Competition is held, from 18.00 hours on the day preceding the Competition until the Competition is finished.
- 10.3 Bell: A bell must be provided for the President of the Ground Jury.
- 10.4 Copy Rights: any athlete entered by his or her NF in the AEF U-21 Dressage Championship concedes the rights of any photographs of the athlete and/or horse and accepts their publication in the AEF website or relevant AEF publications.
- 10.5 The Championship must be organized strictly according to FEI Rules.
- 10.6 The AEF is entitled to make reasonable amendments to the present rules.
- 10.7 All trot work is executed "sitting", unless otherwise indicated in the test.



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ARTICLE 11 – SCHEDULES & FINALISTS

The OC in the Final Competition is responsible for the inland transportation of foreign participants including International Technical Officials, Chefs d'Equipe (one only per NF) and Athletes, as well as the accommodation (board and lodging) during the competition. The amount of the sponsorship from AEF to the OC for organizing the Finals and subsidizing the aforesaid expenses as well as the air travel expense and per diem during the sojourn for the Officials will be further decided by AEF.
